Prayer of Confession and Words of Affirmation (*John*)

ALL: Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: We pray for those who are numbed, who are angry, who are desolate because they have been bereaved. For this we say:

ALL: Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: We pray for those caught up in war and violence and hatred; especially the innocent victims of these evils. For this we say:

ALL: Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: We pray at this time of financial turmoil, for those who have lost jobs, those who struggle to pay bills and those who have the power to affect positive change. For this we say:

ALL: Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: We pray for those who love the earth and give voice to its needs, its wounds, its potential, that we might be drawn into a deeper communion with God's creation of which we are but a part. For this we say:

ALL: Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: What would you like to lift up in prayer? (pause)

For all of these and our other prayers, we say:

ALL: Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: Be with us all, Lord: in all our daily struggles as we seek to follow you. Be with us all, Lord: in
