

Prayer of Confession and Words of Affirmation (8:30 John, Tom H.; 11 Stacey,)

JOSEPH: God is patient with us, not wanting any to perish. Yet we have turned away from holiness and godliness. We have chosen to fit into society rather than give leadership for a new day. Let the church confess its failure.

LEADER: God of Advent, as we await your coming, we confess the rough places of our own hearts.

VOICE 1: We confess the angers that become stony roadblocks to your peace.

VOICE 2: We confess the mountains of hurt feelings we leave behind us through thoughtlessness.

LEADER: We confess the crookedness of our motives.

VOICE 1: We confess the pits of despair into which we cast our brothers and sisters by our greed and injustice.

VOICE 2: We confess we are focused more on our own survival than on the mission of our church in the world.

ALL: God, we have failed to prepare the way for Christ's entry into our everyday environment. Pardon and change us, we pray. Amen.

PASTOR: Hear all our prayers, loving God, and answer according to your will and purpose. We pray in Christ's name who taught his disciples to pray, saying:

ALL: Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Advent Creed (Joseph)

PASTORR: The Advent Creed we are using today is a trinitarian creed like the Apostle's Creed, but it draws

on themes of waiting, quiet and silence. We will read it responsively.

We believe in God the Father, creator of heaven and earth.

WOMEN: The one who is full of patience, MFN: who is not afraid of silence.

WOMEN: who does not need to fill each moment with activity and noise.

MFN: The one who is beyond bluster and flurry, WOMEN: and who does not jostle for attention.

PASTOR: We believe in God the Son, Savior of creation,

MEN: who slipped into Bethlehem on night, mostly unnoticed,

WOMEN: who lived thirty years without headlines or hurry, MFN: who frequently took time alone with his patient Father,

WOMEN: who waited for the right time to become the suffering servant,

MEN: who stood quietly before the noise of his accusers,

WOMEN: whose silence overpowered their words,

MFN: who died, then rose again on a quiet Sunday morning. PASTOR: We believe in God the Holy Spirit,

WOMEN: who strengthens, empowers, renews and refreshes,

MEN: sometimes arriving with obvious power,

WOMEN: sometimes with the quiet breath of a whisper.

PASTOR: We believe in one God WOMEN: who patiently waits for us,

MEN: and who longs for us to do the same.
