

Greeting and Announcements (8:30 *John*, 11 *Alane*)

Advent, from the Latin *adventus*, meaning arrival or coming, is a chance for us to slow down and take time to prepare for Jesus' birth at Christmas. It is an opportunity for us to reflect quietly on what Jesus' coming to earth really means for us, in contrast with the headlong rush towards Christmas Day, parties, presents and turkey we experience in the world outside the church.

"Instead of plunging into Christmas early, advent holds back and emphasizes preparation and expectant waiting for the coming of Jesus into the world. Advent looks at the arrival of Jesus as a baby in Bethlehem 2000 years ago, his coming into the hearts of Christian people today; and his expected second coming at the end of time in judgment and glory." (Channel 4 website, faith page)

Traditionally, the color purple or blue, symbolizing penitence and preparation, is used by churches at Advent.

During the Music for Centering Prayer, you will be given a card with a prayer printed on it and a purple ribbon attached. We want to encourage you to wear the ribbon or stick it to your computer or somewhere that you will see it every day during the next four weeks.

Use the ribbon and the prayer card as a reminder to slow down to prepare for Christmas with expectant waiting, rather than speed up to get through the list of things you need to do. We will use the prayer this morning at the end of the Advent wreath candle lighting.
