

### Word of God Proclaimed (8:30 Joseph, 11 Jan)

(8:30 *John*, 11 *Jan*)

Numbers 21:4-9 John 3:14-21

LEADER: The second reading is from the Gospel of John, chapter 3, verses 14-21. We will read it responsively with three readers. When Nicodemus went to Jesus secretly at night, Jesus, referring to Numbers 21:4-9, said to him,

READER 1: And just as Moses

- ALL: lifted up
- READER 2: the serpent in the wilderness,
- READER 3: so must the Son of Man be
- ALL: lifted up,
- READER 1: that whoever believes in him
- ALL: may have eternal life.
- READER 2: For God
- READER 3: so loved the world
- READER 1: that he gave his only Son,
- READER 2: so that everyone who believes in him
- READER 3: may not perish
- ALL: **but may have eternal life.**
- READER 1: Indeed, God did not send the Son
- READER 2: into the world to condemn the world,
- READER 3: but in order that the world might be saved

### ALL: through him.

- READER 1: Those who believe in him
- READER 2: are not condemned;
- READER 3: but those who do not believe
- READER 2: are condemned already,
- READER 3: because they have not believed
- READER 1: in the name of the only Son of God.
- READER 3: And this is the judgment, that

### ALL: the light

- READER 2: has come into the world,
- READER 3: and people loved darkness rather than
- ALL: light
- READER 1: because their deeds were evil.
- READER 2: For all who do evil hate

ALL: the light READER 3: and do not come to ALL: the light. READER 1: so that their deeds may not be exposed. READER 2: But those who do what is true come to ALL: the light. READER 3: so that it may be clearly seen ALL: that their deeds have been done in God. This is the word of God for the people of God. LEADER: ALL: Thanks be to God.
