

Sermon (Joseph) "Last Words: Before It Is Too Late, Turn Around"

The Nicene Creed #880 (red *Joseph*)

- ALL: 1. We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
 - 2. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God,


