

LEADER: Blessed be the God, the Father of our Savior Jesus Christ. Thank God for every spiritual blessing.

Prayer of Confession and Words of Affirmation (*Joseph*)

PASTOR: God has chosen us to be holy and blameless in love before our Creator. In our hearts, we know

we do not measure up to that high calling. We have built many barriers in our lives against true communion with God and honest community with one another. In our prayer of confession, we

seek help to remove those barriers.

ALL: God of all hope and blessing, hear us as we turn to you with all our hearts. We have not been faithful to your word of love. We have hurt others and held grudges. We have been

jealous and deceitful and ungrateful. We have turned from your Word and resisted the Holy Spirit. We have wanted our inheritance from you without the responsibilities that go with it. O God, we plead for your forgiveness and healing that we might respond with joy

to the spiritual blessings you offer. Amen.

PASTOR: God's grace is freely given to us in Jesus Christ, through whom we are redeemed and forgiven.

Prayers of the People and the Lord's Prayer #895 (red *Joseph*)

PASTOR: God of overwhelming love and grace, in this Ordinary Season we come before you in prayer. We remember how you chose to live among us, declaring that our world was a worthy place for you

and we were the reason for Christ to come. And so, at this time, we pray for our world and all who live in it. May we live in the realization of who and whose we are. For this we say,

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: We pray for our international, national and local leaders, for firefighters and law enforcement personnel, that they will turn to you for wisdom when making difficult decisions. For this we say,

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: This day we think and pray for those for whom this is a difficult time. For those who are missing loved ones who have died or are far away. For those who are grieving the loss of a job, the loss of a relationship or the loss of hope. For this we say,

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: We pray for those who are unable to be surrounded by family or others. We especially pray for refugees. For this we say,

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: We think of and pray for all for whom an emphasis on "stuff" simply underscores not having enough. And we think of how grateful we are that you have sent Jesus into our world and into our lives. So, in thankfulness, we say,

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: What other prayer needs would you like to lift up? (pause) For these and all other prayers in our hearts, we say,

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: How might we reflect his message or thankfulness in our daily living? How might we share with others the true joy that Christ brings into our lives? How can we — like all children — offer you the praise you deserve? Open our hearts, loving God. Stretch our understanding of our world that we might find new ways to journey with others in the days to come. We ask this in the name of Jesus who taught his disciples to pray, saying:

ALL: Our Father, who art in heaven, hollowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever.
