

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: We lift to You, O God, for relief, those who are on our prayer list and for joy, whose who celebrate their birthday or wedding anniversary in the week to come. For this we say,

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: What would you like to lift up in prayer? (pause) For these, our prayers, we say,

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

PASTOR: Knowing and believing that the One who calls us is faithful, now and always, we wrap these and all our prayers in the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples, saying:

ALL: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. "What If It Happens to Me? The Fear of Suffering"

Sacrament of Holy Communion (*John*)

PASTOR: The Lord is with you.

ALL: And also with you.

PASTOR: Lift up your hearts.

ALL: We lift them up to the Lord.

PASTOR: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

ALL: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

PASTOR: It is right and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to You, God Almighty, creator of heaven and earth. And so, with Your people on earth and all the company of heaven, we praise Your name and join their unending hymn:

PASTOR: Holy are You and blessed is Your Son, Jesus Christ. By the baptism of his suffering, death and resurrection, You gave birth to Your church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit. On the night in which he gave himself for us, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to You, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples and said, "take, eat; this is my body with is given for you. word and I shall be healed, through Jesus Christ my Lord. Amen.

PASTOR: Hear the good news: Christ died for us while we were yet sinners; that is proof of God's love to-

ward us. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven.

ALL: Amen. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven.

PASTOR: Amen.
