

Sacrament of Holy Communion

One of the traditions of the Muscogee/Creek Nation is when their churches celebrate Holy Communion, the Communion elements are brought into the worship by some of the women of the church. Using women represents the women who went to the tomb and they were the first to proclaim Jesus' resurrection.

Invitation to the Prayer of Confession (*Joseph*)

PASTOR: Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin and seek to live in peace with one another. Therefore, let us confess our sin before God and one another.

We pray to you, Great Mystery — and giver of life. We come to you feeling so blessed. We come to you with sins to confess and in moments of fear. We look for comfort, we shed our tears.

ALL: We pray to you, our loving God. We ask for cleansing of our hearts and minds. We ask you to anoint us with loving hands, in our efforts to bring peace and tranquility. We ask for courage; we ask for humility.

PASTOR: We pray to you, O God our protector — O Holy, Holy Spirit. We ache in our hearts for all those in pain. We have sinned by ignoring, we are in disdain. And we seek your guidance as we explore changes we can make to open new doors.

ALL: And we pray to you, Great Spirit, Creator of this universe — that as we reflect and pray this special time, you will move us to action and answers we will find that can help native peoples with the issues we face.

PASTOR: So, we pray, Precious Spirit, as the eagle awaits to take our prayers to your heavenly gates, for strength to give of ourselves what we can to the original, the indigenous people of this land. This we ask, this we pray, this very special day. Amen.

The Great Thanksgiving

PASTOR: The Lord be with you.

ALL: And also with you.

PASTOR: Lift up your hearts.

ALL: We lift them up to the Lord.

PASTOR: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

ALL: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

PASTOR: It is right, and a good and joyful thing always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

ALL: Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

PASTOR: Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. By the baptism of his suffering, death and resurrection, you gave birth to your church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit. On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given to you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

ALL: And so, in remembrance of these, your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice in union with Christ's offering for us as we proclaim the mystery of faith. Christ has died; Christ has risen; Christ will come again.

PASTOR: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and juice. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ redeemed by his blood. By your spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet. Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your Holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and forever. Amen.

And now, with the confidence of children of God, let us pray the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples:

ALL: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.
