Prayer of Confession and Words of Affirmation (Joseph)

(based on I Kings 19:1-15a)

PASTOR: When we ask to be delivered from deceitful and unjust people, we need to examine ourselves to

see if we are completely honest and just. When we sense demonic forces in our world, we must ask if there is any evil in us. When we are tempted to exclude, we are met by an inclusive God

who calls us to repentance.

MEN: "What are you doing here?" asks God. "What are you doing here in the silence, among those

who have no voice, among those who have been silenced? What sound will fill the silence?"

Women: What are you doing here in the injustice, amid the imbalance of the world, amid the unfairness of

people's lives? What act will transform the suffering?
