PASTOR: Breathe upon our gathering, O Spirit of God. Grant each of us a place to humbly receive and to faithfully serve, that we might know in this brief gathering a foretaste of that greater communion yet to come. O God, enlarge our hearts. O Spirit, expand our vision. O Christ, establish your kingdom among us. Be at work even now, O Lord. May your will, in us, in these hours, be accomplished. Lord, in your mercy.

PASTOR: If our hearts have already been tempted this day to believe anything about ourselves or others that does not take into account your creation, your mercy, your sacrifice, your grace, your forgiveness, your redemption, and your unshakable love, O God, remind us again of these truths, giving us faith enough to believe and hope enough to choose to embrace them again and again. PASTOR: Mighty God, all day long you are working for my good. I too often get caught up in what is hap-

pening for others and struggle to focus on the ways you are blessing me. Open my eyes to see the ways that even today you blessed me: in surprising moments, through other people, by opening doors and providing opportunities, in using my mistakes or shortcomings to teach me, by offering me opportunities to impact other people. Keep me focused on the work that you are doing in and through me, and may I not neglect to see you blessing my life or ignore your call to bless others. Lord, in your mercy.

ALL: **Hear our prayer.**

PASTOR: Loving God, who holds together all things, we pray for our immediate community; particularly those in seasons of loneliness, need, or grief. Those suffering from ailing physical or mental health. Would you bring life to our bodies and reveal yourself as near to us. Lord, in your mercy.

ALL: **Hear our prayer.**

PASTOR: God our seamstress, call us out of our shame. We are curled up inside ourselves, afraid to be seen because we cannot bear the sight of our own faces. But this is agony. Remind us what we were meant for. When Adam and Eve hid from you and covered their bodies out of shame, you were the God who knelt down in the dirt to make them clothing. Help us to remember that it is not your character to humiliate, but to do whatever you can so that we might come out of our hiding and stand in the presence of one another again. Free us from the secret things we speak over ourselves — words of self-hatred and disgust. Guide us toward a self-understanding that heals, and release us from the ugly wanderings of mind and spirit that pull us back into hiding. Remind us that shame is a liar. We will not give our chains a voice.
